Ministry Descriptions

We are thankful for your willingness to put your spiritual gifts to work and volunteer! Here you'll find a brief explanation of opportunities you can sign up for in the current year. Mark your choices on the serving form and submit that to us. You may also sign up online at redlandhills.org/volunteer

KIDS

Sunday leader: The leader's role is to introduce and share a glimpse of who God is for the children. Using the provided curriculum, the leader will guide the students through the bible (rotating thru old and new testament themes) while making real life applications for them. Our desire is to partner with and develop God loving, God serving, and God focused families. This position requires a background check.

Sunday & Wednesday assistant: Assist Leader in discussions and activities with children. Helps to keep flow moving, minimize distractions. Help with bathroom breaks. This position requires a background check.

Wednesday leader: Lead the children in a monthly discussion about their relationship with God. Help them develop a knowledge of and a love for God and God's plan for their life. Curriculum & materials provided. This position requires a background check.

Check-in Desk: We use the elvanto check-In software to securely check our children into class. Each child is checked in and given a generated name label along with a parent label. The parent label is needed to check the child out at the end of service. You will ask for the label when checking out a child. The system is user friendly and requires minimal "touches" per check in.

Security: This is a team effort. Watchful eyes carefully scan the property and building to ensure the safety of our RH family while we're on the property. Extra measures are taken to keep our NextGen area secure and safe with limited access. Teams serve on a rotation.

Busy Bags: We treasure our children, so to help engage their hands and minds, we offer bags filled with puzzles, coloring books, i-spy activities and the like. Your responsibility is to check the bags weekly to remove used activity sheets or torn material and keep the bags filled with new activities.

STUDENTS

Adult helper: Volunteers in our student ministry are encouraged to build encouraging relationships with students and model Christ to them. Students meet Wednesdays at 6:30 pm and also have extra activities.

Host Student Event: If you enjoy the energy and enthusiasm of students, consider hosting an event (like a movie night or game night) in your home. The youth leaders will coordinate with you.

Pray for a Student: Students face a variety of challenges in this season of rapid change during middle and high school years. You will be provided one or more names to keep covered in prayer.

Service To Others

Prayer Team: Keeping the needs of the body before God is a critical ministry. This team will receive the prayer request from the church and pray over them. You'll also have the opportunity to be in the prayer room during a service to keep the congregation covered as we worship.

Encouragement: Do you like to write notes and cards of encouragement? This team will bless others with uplifting words as we have needs both inside the church and outside.

Meal Preparation: Difficult seasons in the lives of others is an opportunity to show love. The loss of a loved one, the birth of a baby, a sickness, and many other events may be a reason we provide meals for a family to make life a little easier in their season. When the need arises, you'll have an opportunity to provide a meal for a family.

Home Projects: Are you good at working with your hands in helpful home repair projects? This is the opportunity for you! This group of people will respond to the needs of the body or community when someone has a need we can help fix for an elderly person, disabled, or someone who is struggling financially.

Local Opportunities: We want to facilitate a partnership with local ministries and our available volunteers. Sample opportunities may include the Elmore County Pregnancy Center, food bank, schools, etc. We'll put you in contact with areas that fit your interests.

Prison Ministry: David Noles coordinates an important ministry to inmates at a season in their life when they may be very open to change. A background check will be required.

International Mission Trip: Are you interested in serving abroad? Wes leads a surgical mission trip annually to the nation of Malawi in southeast Africa (no medical background required). Visit chikondihealth.org to learn more. Opportunities to work with kids and in other countries also exist.

Hospitality

Doorholder: This position is a critical component of how we welcome guests to our church. You are part of the front line of a friendly face, able to provide directions, and assist them in getting to the worship center. You may be scheduled to physically open the door, be on the porch, or staff the welcome table. You will be asked to arrive approximately 45 minutes prior to the service.

Parking Team: This position is an outdoor volunteer who greets people in the parking lot with helpful instructions. You will point guests to the appropriate guest parking spots and help disabled find the nearest handicapped parking. In the event the gravel parking lot is full, you will direct vehicles to the overflow area. You will be provided a reflective vest, assist in placing flags and signage, and asked to check in approximately 45 minutes before the service begins.

Communion Preparer: This volunteer will prepare the trays that will be used in communion time during the worship service. You will be asked to arrive approximately 45 minutes prior to the service.

Coffee Bar Host: The Atrium is the first stop as guests and members arrive on Sunday mornings. You'll make it a welcoming environment by keeping the coffee pots filled and supplies available. After the service has concluded you will wash the coffee urns.

Prepare A Meal for StartingPath: StartingPath is the primary way we incorporate guests into our church family and plug them in to ministry. This class includes a lunch that we provide. You'll be assigned a date and asked to

prepare for a small number of people, help set it up, and get food served. We will provide you a sample menu if desired.

StartingPath Host: This host position is in place from the moment the service is dismissed to guide guest to meal, welcome them, engage in conversation over the meal, and contribute to the discussion. This is a great opportunity to build relationships with our guests.

Sunday Host: Each Sunday we will assign one person to be the eyes and ears for the big picture of the worship experience. Volunteers will check in with you for their assignments. You'll identify any gaps or problems that occur on a Sunday and help find quick solutions. For example, if our seating fills up, you'll grab a volunteer to put out additional seating. You'll be asked to arrive approximately 1 hour prior to the worship service.

Worship

Band & Vocals: Are you skilled in playing an instrument or vocally talented? We'll give you the opportunity to attend a rehearsal and engage with the worship team to see if we have position for you.

Technology Team: Each Sunday requires 3 essential positions to assist with audio, video, and lighting. Whether you are an experienced volunteer or new to this area, we can provide you with the right training to make Sunday a powerful worship experience. You'll be asked to arrive approximately 1 hour prior to the worship service.

Community Groups

Group Leader: Training is provided. The primary role is to help group members take next steps in their walk with God. A group leader coach guides you through your role.

Participate In A Group: We want to encourage every RHC member to be plugged into a group to grow. If we can assist you in getting in the right group, we'd love to help.

Facility

Yard Work: Volunteers on this team will be on a rotation to help keep our grass cut, weed eat, shrubbery trimmed, and other essential tasks. For those that enjoy gardening, occasional landscaping with flowers and other seasonal items will be needed.

Cleaning Team: Our 8,000 sq. ft. facility requires love and attention to host our weekly worship and other events. In order to maximize our resources for ministry, we have planned to use volunteers to assist in keeping our facility clean. Volunteers on this team will serve on an occasional rotation to sweep, vacuum, mop, clean windows & bathrooms, etc.
